ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER H-2024-22

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RESCINDING, VACATING, OR
SUPERSEDING DESIGNATED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDERS:**

H-2019-5; H-2022-48-B; H-2022-49; H-2020-47

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge for Hernando County has entered numerous administrative orders throughout the years; and,

WHEREAS, some of these orders are now outdated, or no longer necessary, and have not been purged, vacated, superseded, or rescinded by other orders, and have not been removed from the file of active administrative orders; and

WHEREAS, many administrative orders were entered for the limited purpose of establishing initial procedural policies, and it is not the intent to the undersigned to eliminate, or vacate any procedural policies which may have been established by administrative order, but rather to simply eliminate unneeded orders for established policy;

IT IS THEREFORE

ORDERED and ADJUDGED as follows:


1. The following administrative orders of Hernando County are hereby rescinded, vacated, or superseded (or may have already been vacated or superseded) and shall be removed from the index of current administrative orders:

2. Any procedures which may currently be established as policy by the provisions of any administrative order vacated above, and not superseded by another order shall remain intact pending subsequent policy memorandum, or administrative order, unless otherwise indicated.

3. Vacation or rescission of any administrative order does not re-instate any force or effect of any prior related administrative order. Likewise, with any superseded administrative order. This order may be subject to amendment as the circumstances require.
