#### ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. A-2024-48-B

# SECOND AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER CLOSING COURTS IN RESPONSE TO HURRICANE MILTON (amended to extend closure of ALL COURTS in the Circuit)

WHEREAS, Hurricane Milton has caused widespread, significant damage, power outages, and flooding throughout the entirety of the Fifth Judicial Circuit when it made landfall on the west coast of Florida as a powerful and dangerous hurricane and moved across the Florida peninsula; and

**WHEREAS,** the Governor of Florida has declared a state of emergency to include every county within the Fifth Judicial Circuit; and

**WHEREAS,** public schools, county governments, and other public and private services are closed throughout the Fifth Judicial Circuit; and

WHEREAS, mandatory evacuations in Hernando and Citrus Counties, the resulting strain on infrastructure and supplies, power outages throughout the Circuit, and in the interest of the health and safety of Circuit employees and litigants, extending the closure of all

courts in the Fifth Judicial Circuit is necessary; and

**BASED UPON**, the recommendation after consultation and concurrence with the Administrative Judges of Citrus, Hernando, Lake, Marion, and Sumter Counties, and the Fifth Judicial Circuit Emergency Response Team that all of the courts of the Fifth Judicial Circuit should remain closed until 8:00 a.m. Monday. October 14, 2024;

#### It is therefore,

#### ORDERED and ADJUDGED as follows:

- 1. **ALL COURTS** of the Fifth Judicial Circuit, including the County Courts in Citrus, Hernando, Lake, Marion, and Sumter Counties are closed and will remain closed until 8:00 a.m. Monday, October 14, 2024.
- 2. The intent of this Order is to have the courts of the Fifth Judicial Circuit to be operating normally at 8:00 a.m. Monday, October 14, 2024, however further developments regarding the effects of the aftermath of Hurricane Milton, may demand amendment.
